1) Gaming cultural memories? Digital games as immersive tools in memory cultures

Host: Dr. Tabea Widmann, Stiftung digitale Spielekultur

This workshop focuses on digital games as enriching tools for our current memory culture surrounding the Holocaust. Tracing the constantly negotiated sphere of contact between memory culture and digital games, this workshop will highlight the potential that games hold as memory media as well as offer the participants the opportunity to try out games themselves and discuss their experiences with each other.

2) Digital Participation and Commemoration with digital media

This workshop discusses participatory digital approaches and methods in historical and civic educational settings. We will get to know various digital participation tools that work well in educational contexts. We will as well prototype a complex educational approach in which we build our own virtual world on a specific historical or civic educational topic, into which we can immerse ourselves with the help of VR glasses.

3) Holocaust Distortion and Hate Speech on Social Media

Host: Tessa Bouwman, Herinneringscentrum Kamp Westerbork

In this workshop we will explore and discuss different cases of Holocaust distortion and hate speech on social media. Furthermore, we will focus on strategies for recognizing and successfully countering these types of content. You are encouraged to bring your own examples.
